# **More Vaccinated Travel Lane flights**

1. Singapore is expanding the Vaccinated Travel Lane (VTL) arrangement to include the following countries: Canada, Denmark, France, Italy, the Netherlands, Spain, the United Kingdom (UK) and the United States of America (USA), from 19 October 2021, and South Korea from 15 November 2021. This is on top of the existing VTL arrangements with Germany and Brunei.

The VTL allows quarantine-free\* travel from these countries to Singapore for eligible vaccinated travellers.

That means eligible customers may travel freely between Singapore and Canada, Denmark, France, Germany, Italy, the Netherlands, Spain, the United Kingdom, and the United States of America via the VTL from 19 October 2021, and South Korea from 15 November 2021.

\*Singapore citizens and permanent residents (PR) may enter all VTL countries, except for Brunei, without quarantine restrictions.

#### 2. Designated Vaccinated Travel Lane (VTL) Flights

Singapore Airlines will operate new VTL services from Amsterdam, Barcelona, Copenhagen, Milan, New York, Paris, Rome, London, and Los Angeles from 19 October 2021. VTL services from Seoul will begin on 16 November 2021.

Travel from Singapore to these destinations can be on any Singapore Airlines flight, while travel from these destinations to Singapore must be on designated Vaccinated Travel Lane (VTL) flights.

Eligible customers must ensure that they are booked on the designated VTL flights. Please click on the links below for the respective countries' VTL flight schedule:

Please note that all other flights not mentioned in the flight schedules above are non-VTL flights. Customers who fly on non-VTL flights will undergo the prevailing quarantine restrictions in Singapore. All customers are advised to ensure that they are booked on the correct flights.

Travellers are also allowed to transit through Singapore on these VTL flights if they meet all applicable VTL eligibility requirements.

## 3. Vaccinated Travel Lane Eligibility Criteria and Health Measures

Customers who wish to travel via any of the Vaccinated Travel Lanes must meet all eligibility VTL criteria and required health measures.

Please note that a different set of eligibility criteria applies to customers who wish to travel between South Korea and Singapore. For more information on the bilateral travel agreement between South Korea and Singapore, please click here.

With effect from 19 October 2021, the VTL requirements\* for these travellers entering or transiting in Singapore include:

No travel history outside of Singapore and the VTL countries in the past 14 days. Travel to
multiple VTL countries in the itinerary is allowed. Please note that transit countries are
considered part of your travel history. You will not be eligible for a VTL flight if you have
transited through a non-VTL country within the past 14 days.

For example, a passenger can fly from Singapore to Paris, and then Paris to Amsterdam, and be eligible to fly on the VTL flight from Amsterdam to Singapore.

However, a passenger who flies from Singapore to Los Angeles via Tokyo, will **not** be eligible for the VTL flight from Los Angeles to Singapore, if the stay in Los Angeles is less than 14 days.

- Being fully vaccinated against Covid-19 with any vaccine in the <u>World Health Organisation</u> <u>Emergency Use List</u>. The final dose must be completed at least 14 days prior to arrival in Singapore.
- Providing a vaccination certificate in English issued by Singapore or the VTL country, or the European Union Digital Covid Certificate (EUDCC) issued by any VTL country. The Smart Health Card from Canada and USA are also accepted.
- All vaccination certificates, except for those issued in Brunei, must be digitally certifiable (i.e.
  with a QR code for verification). For VTL passengers travelling from Brunei, a hard copy of
  the vaccination certificate issued by the Brunei Government will be accepted.
- Please note that the CovPass or the International Certificate of Vaccination or Prophylaxis (ICVP), also known as the Carte Jaune or Yellow Card, will not be accepted.
- Residents of the EU or Singapore who were previously unvaccinated and had recovered from a past Covid-19 infection are considered fully vaccinated if they have received at least one dose of <u>an approved vaccine</u>. Such travellers will be required to provide an EU recovery certificate from Covid-19, or a discharge memo issued in Singapore.
- Taking a pre-departure Covid-19 PCR test within 48 hours before flight departure, and receiving a negative result
- Flying only on designated VTL flights
- For VTL travellers entering Singapore, they are also required to <u>register and make payment</u> for an on-arrival PCR test at Changi Airport.

<sup>\*</sup>For customers travelling from Brunei or Germany via the existing VTL arrangement, the new VTL requirements will apply from 19 October 2021.

Short-term visitors and Long-Term Pass holders must apply for a <u>Vaccinated Travel Pass (VTP)</u> between seven and 30 days prior to their intended date of entry into Singapore. Travellers may apply for the VTP from 12 October 2021.

Singapore citizens and permanent residents are not required to apply for the Vaccinated Travel Pass. However, they must show their vaccination status on the HealthHub app, or present proof of their vaccination at check-in.

Short-term visitors who require a visa for travel to Singapore must separately obtain a visa. They are advised to do so after receiving their VTP approval and before departure.

All visitors must also purchase travel insurance, with a minimum coverage of \$\$30,000 for Covid-19-related medical treatment and hospitalisation costs, prior to travel to Singapore.

They must also use the <u>TraceTogether</u> app in Singapore to facilitate contact tracing.

### 4. Customers with Existing Bookings

Customers with existing bookings will be notified if their flight has been designated as a VTL flight.

Customers who do not meet the VTL requirements may opt to be reaccommodated onto non-VTL flights instead. Please note that passengers travelling on non-VTL flights must meet the entry requirements for Singapore, and will have to serve quarantine.

Customers may request to rebook or seek a refund of the unused portion of their ticket though the travel agents that the ticket was purchased.
