



Advisory on Temporary U.S. Entry Restrictions for Travellers Returning from Ebola Affected Areas

Dear Trade Partners

To reduce the risk of Ebola entering the United States (U.S.), the U.S. has introduced temporary travel restrictions for passengers who have recently been in the affected areas.

1. Travellers who have been in the Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC)

- Any traveller (including U.S. citizens and U.S. nationals) who has been in the DRC within 21 days before their flight **will not** be permitted to board a commercial flight to, or transit through the United States.
- U.S. citizens and U.S. nationals who have been in the DRC must remain outside the DRC for 21 days before traveling to the United States.

2. Travellers who have been in Uganda or South Sudan

- U.S. citizens and U.S. nationals who have been in Uganda or South Sudan, **but have not been in the DRC**, within the 21 days before arriving in the U.S. may travel.
- However, they must enter the U.S. only through one of the four designated airports listed below for enhanced CDC health screening:
 - Washington Dulles International Airport (IAD), Dulles, Virginia
 - Hartsfield-Jackson Atlanta International Airport (ATL), Atlanta
 - George Bush Intercontinental Airport (IAH), Houston
 - John F. Kennedy International Airport (JFK), New York
- For travellers (U.S. citizens and residents) affected by the restriction and have booked their tickets through a travel agency, they should seek assistance from their respective travel agent for any bookings or refunds.

Travellers should refer to the U.S Centre for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) website for the latest updates on the entry requirements.
